I. Overview

To adapt to the new changes brought by scientific and technological development and technological progress to the fields of industry production, construction, management and services, conform to the new trends of digitalization, networking and intelligentization in the field of customs affairs and foreign trade services, meet the new requirements of positions (groups) such as customs clearance and foreign trade document processing and review, import and export commodity classification, customs operation, international freight forwarding operation, customs scheme planning and consulting, international logistics scheme planning and consulting, and cross-border trade compliance management under new industries, new business forms and new models, continuously satisfy the demand for high-quality skilled talents driven by the high-quality development of the customs affairs and foreign trade services sector, promote the professional upgrading and digital transformation of vocational education, improve the quality of talent training, follow the overall requirements for advancing the high-quality development of modern vocational education, and refer to the compilation requirements of relevant national standards, the school has formulated the talent training program for the Customs Affairs and Foreign Trade Services major in accordance with the new standards, combining the regional/industrial reality and its own school-running orientation, and encourages the development of distinctive features beyond the standards.

VI. Training Objectives

This major aims to cultivate high-skilled talents who can practice core socialist values, inherit the civilization of skills, achieve all-round development of morality, intelligence, physical fitness, aesthetics and labor education, possess a certain level of scientific and cultural literacy, good humanistic quality, scientific literacy, digital literacy, professional ethics and innovative awareness, as well as the professional spirit of dedication and the craftsman spirit of striving for excellence. They should have strong employment and entrepreneurship capabilities and sustainable

development abilities, master the professional knowledge and technical skills of this major, and possess comprehensive professional qualities and operational capabilities. Facing the occupations of Customs Declarers and Logistics Service Specialists in industries such as road transportation, water transportation, air transportation, multimodal transport and transport agency services, loading, unloading, handling and warehousing, postal services, internet and related services, and business services, graduates will be capable of engaging in work including customs declaration form filling and review, import and export commodity classification, import and export tax calculation, customs clearance services, customs consulting, and AEO certification services.

VII. Training Specifications

On the basis of systematically studying professional knowledge and completing relevant internships and practical training, students of this major should comprehensively improve their knowledge, abilities and qualities, master and practically apply the core professional technical skills required by the positions (groups), and achieve all-round development of morality, intelligence, physical fitness, aesthetics and labor education. In general, they must meet the following requirements:

(1) Firmly uphold the leadership of the Communist Party of China and the socialist system with Chinese characteristics, be guided by Xi Jinping Thought on Socialism with Chinese Characteristics for a New Era, practice core socialist values, and possess firm ideals and beliefs, profound patriotic feelings and a sense of Chinese national pride;

(2) Master national laws and industry regulations related to the professional activities corresponding to this major, grasp relevant knowledge and skills in environmental protection, safety protection, quality management, etc., understand the culture of relevant industries, have the professional spirit of dedication, abide by professional ethics and codes of conduct, and possess a sense of social responsibility and commitment;

(3) Master the necessary cultural basic knowledge such as Chinese, mathematics, foreign languages (English, etc.) and information technology to support the study and sustainable development of this major, have good humanistic and scientific literacy, and possess career planning capabilities;

(4) Have good verbal and written expression abilities, communication and

cooperation skills, a strong sense of collective and teamwork awareness, learn one foreign language and apply it in combination with this major;

(5) Master the basic professional theoretical knowledge of international trade, customs supervision and international rules, cross-border e-commerce, AEO certification management, and modern logistics management;

(6) Master technical skills such as customs clearance document processing, commodity classification, import and export tax calculation, and international freight forwarding, and possess abilities or practical capabilities in customs scheme design, international supply chain scheme design, and emergency handling;

(7) Master basic knowledge of information technology and possess digital skills to meet the needs of digitalization and intelligentization development in this field;

(8) Have the ability of inquiry-based learning, lifelong learning and sustainable development, as well as the ability to integrate knowledge and comprehensively apply it to analyze and solve problems;

(9) Master the basic knowledge of physical exercise and at least one sports skill, meet the qualified standards of the national college student physical health test, and develop good exercise habits, hygiene habits and behavioral habits; possess a certain level of psychological adjustment ability;

(10) Master the necessary aesthetic knowledge, have a certain level of cultural accomplishment and aesthetic ability, and form at least one artistic specialty or hobby;

(11) Establish a correct view of labor, respect labor and love labor, possess labor literacy compatible with the professional development of this major, promote the model worker spirit, labor spirit and craftsman spirit, and advocate the contemporary fashion of respecting labor, valuing skills and honoring creation.

related to foreign trade, and master the core professional knowledge of customs affairs;

(3) Skill Mastery: Focus on the core of post practical operation, require students to pay attention to the accuracy and standardization of skills, possess the ability to independently complete the entire process of customs clearance document filling, review and declaration, accurately complete commodity classification and tax calculation, proficiently handle common customs supervision businesses, and ensure the compliance of trade customs clearance;

(4) Problem-Solving: Cultivate the ability of problem insight, require students to stay calm in the face of emergencies, adhere to a pragmatic and innovative problem-solving approach, take the initiative to assume responsibility for problem handling, identify and solve common problems in all stages of customs clearance, address problems in special business scenarios to ensure compliance, and analyze business data to put forward suggestions for process optimization;

(5) Tool Application: Strengthen the ability to improve efficiency, require students to have the awareness of actively learning new tools, use government affairs platforms, professional software and AI tools efficiently and standardizedly, and possess the ability to query and integrate customs business information using the Internet and professional databases;

(6) Professional Norms: Consolidate the bottom line of compliant operation, require students to have a strong sense of rules, strictly follow regulatory requirements and operating procedures, strengthen risk prevention and control awareness, manage business documents in a standardized manner, and ensure the legal and orderly development of business;

(7) Communication: Ensure the smooth connection of business, require students to have good communication etiquette and uphold a sincere and pragmatic communication attitude; respect the positions and needs of communication objects, and possess inclusiveness in cross-cultural communication;

(8) Teamwork: Cultivate the ability of collaborative performance of duties, require students to establish a sense of teamwork and take the initiative to cooperate with the team to complete work tasks; uphold the concept of mutual assistance and win-win results, be willing to share experience and assist colleagues in solving problems;

(9) Sustainable Development: Support long-term career development, require students to establish a sense of lifelong learning, pay attention to industry development trends, possess the ability of post adaptation and transfer, maintain a progressive attitude, courageously accept challenges, and form a sense of innovation and entrepreneurship.

IX. Curriculum Provision

(I) Design Philosophy of the Curriculum System

Based on serving regional economic development and the competency requirements of enterprises for talents in customs declaration and international freight forwarding, this major conducts surveys on enterprise talent needs and graduate follow-ups. In accordance with the employment standards of industry enterprises, starting from the analysis of professional positions, the curriculum teaching objectives are positioned at the core vocational competencies required by the positions. The content of vocational qualification certificate examinations is integrated into the curriculum system, and the curriculum system of the Customs Affairs and Foreign Trade Services major is reconstructed in combination with the laws of higher vocational education.

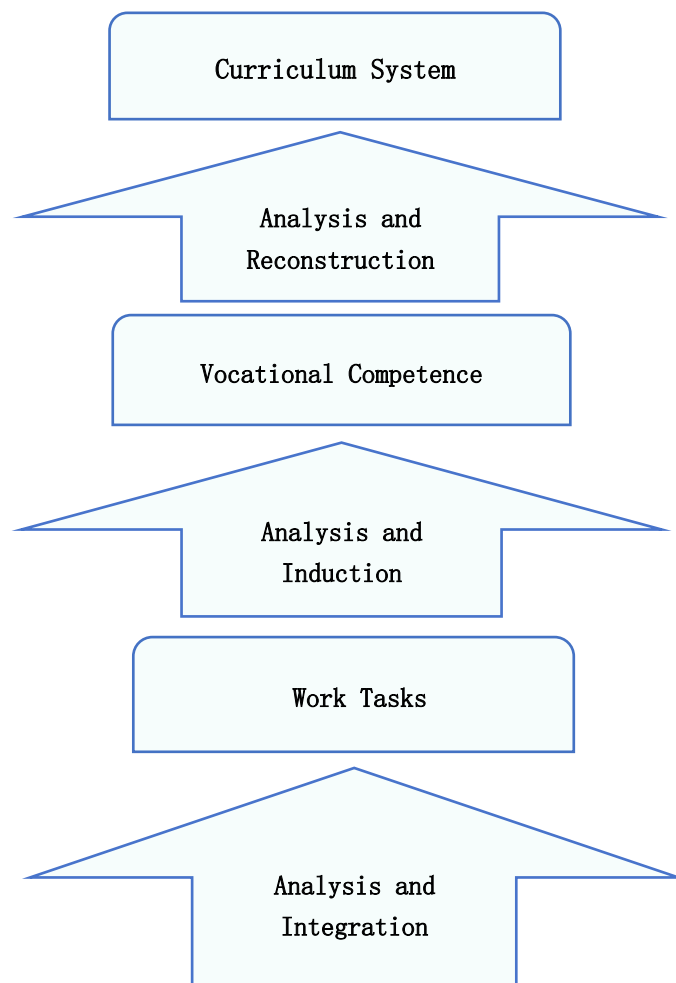

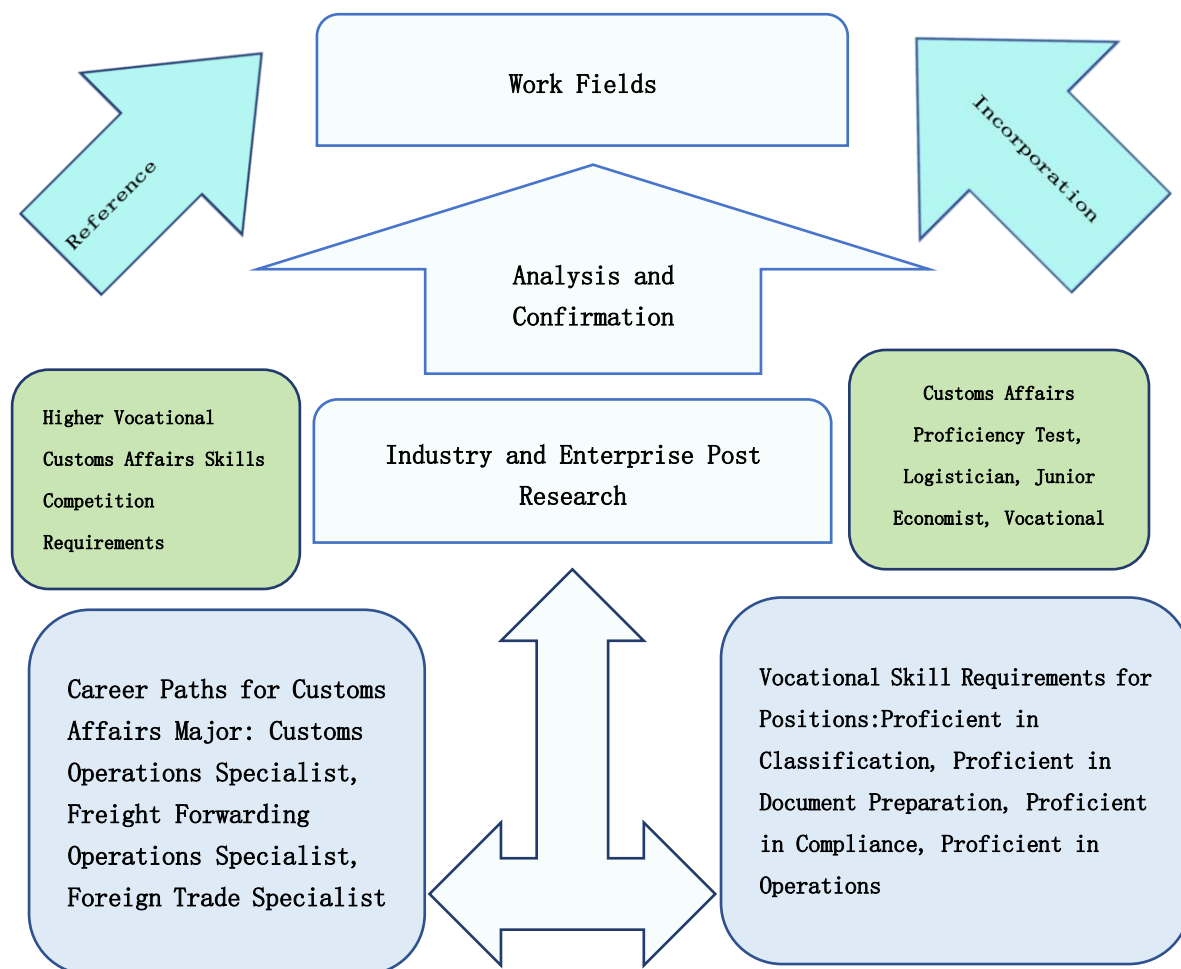

(III) Curriculum System Framework

The curriculum system is structured with the cultivation of vocational and technical skills as the main line, consisting of five levels: public basic courses, professional basic courses, professional core courses, professional elective courses, and intensive practical teaching. It emphasizes starting from the analysis of professional positions, positioning the curriculum teaching objectives at the core vocational competencies required by the positions, integrating the content of vocational qualification certificate examinations into the curriculum system, and reconstructing the curriculum system of the Customs Affairs and Foreign Trade Services major in combination with the laws of higher vocational education.

1. Public Basic Courses

Public basic courses shall be offered in full compliance with the relevant national regulations.

Compulsory public basic courses include Ideological and Moral Cultivation and Legal Basis, Introduction to Mao Zedong Thought and the Theoretical System of Socialism with Chinese Characteristics, Introduction to Xi Jinping Thought on Socialism with Chinese Characteristics for a New Era, Physical Education, Military Theory and Military Training, College Students' Mental Health Education, and Labor Education. Courses such as History of the Communist Party of China, Introduction to Xi Jinping Thought on the Rule of Law, Excellent Traditional Chinese Culture, Foreign Languages, National Security Education, Information Technology, Art, Career Development and Employment Guidance, and Innovation and Entrepreneurship Education are designated as compulsory courses or restricted elective courses.

2. Professional Courses

Professional courses consist of professional basic courses, professional core courses, and professional elective courses. Professional basic courses are composed of foundational theoretical knowledge and skills that require preliminary learning, serving as the basis for professional core courses by providing theoretical and technical support. Professional core courses are designed based on job content and typical work tasks, acting as the backbone to cultivate core vocational competencies. Professional elective courses are horizontally expanded and vertically deepened according to students' development needs, serving as extended courses to enhance comprehensive vocational capabilities.

The college independently determines courses in combination with regional/industry realities, school-running orientation, and talent training needs, and conducts modular curriculum design. Relying on real production projects and typical work tasks that reflect new methods, new technologies, new processes, and new standards, it carries out project-based and situational teaching, and implements the digital transformation of curriculum teaching with the integration of technologies such as artificial intelligence. Meanwhile, the college actively collaborates with its school-enterprise cooperation partner, Shanghai Xingya Customs Declaration Co., Ltd., to co-construct resources and cultivate talents. It integrates the enterprise's Dianjieda System into courses to highlight the application effects of AI technology in customs affairs, and explores and innovates the curriculum system in light of teaching practice.

(1) Professional Basic Courses

Mainly include content in fields such as International Trade Basics, Fundamentals of Economics, Fundamentals of Management, Basics of E-commerce, Modern Logistics Basics, Fundamentals of Commodity Science, Customs Clearance Basics, and International Trade Geography.

(2) Professional Core Courses

Mainly include content in fields such as AI + Tariff Classification, JIT and Intelligent Customs Clearance, AEO Compliance and Risk Control, International Business Document Training, Single Window Comprehensive Training, Transportation Management Practice, and Import and Export Tax Calculation Training.

(3) Professional Elective Courses

Mainly include content in fields such as Freight Forwarding English, Modern Logistics Comprehensive Training, International Freight Forwarding Training, Supply Chain Management, and Commodity Inspection and Quarantine.

(VI) Class Hour Arrangement

The total class hours shall not be less than 2500. Every 16-18 class hours are converted into 1 credit. Among them, the total class hours of public basic courses shall generally not be less than 25% of the total class hours. The class hours of practical teaching shall in principle not be less than 50% of the total class hours, with the cumulative internship time generally being 6 months. The internship can be arranged centrally or in phases according to actual conditions. The cumulative class hours of various elective courses shall not be less than 10% of the total class hours. Activities such as military training, social practice, orientation education, and graduation education are credited at 1 week per credit.

Explanation of Teaching Schedule Arrangement:

1. Flexibly arranged social practice and other activities are not included in the weekly timetable;
2. Military training, labor education practice and other activities unifiedly arranged by the school are not included in the weekly timetable;
3. The Social Practice Week is arranged intensively for one week and is not included in the teaching weeks;
4. The 5th and 6th semesters are for Graduation Comprehensive Practice, lasting 15 weeks, with the last two weeks used for graduating class-related work and other activities;
5. Others.

X. Teaching Staff

The professional teaching team is built in accordance with the requirements of the "Four Qualities of Good Teachers", "Four Unities" and "Four Guides", with teachers' morality and ethics as the primary standard for teacher team building.

(I) Team Structure

The ratio of the number of students to the number of full-time teachers in this major shall not be higher than 25:1; the proportion of "Double-Qualified Teachers" among professional course teachers shall generally not be lower than 60%; the proportion of full-time teachers with senior professional titles shall not be lower than 20%. The full-time teacher team shall consider professional titles, age and work experience to form a reasonable echelon structure.

Integrate high-quality talent resources inside and outside the school, select senior technical personnel from enterprises to serve as industry mentors, establish a teaching team featuring school-enterprise cooperation and combination of full-time and part-time teachers, and set up a regular professional (disciplinary) teaching and research mechanism.

Educational Structure: Among the 11 full-time teachers, all have a bachelor's degree or above. Among them, 10 have a master's degree or educational background, and 1 has a bachelor's degree.

Professional Title Structure: The professional title structure is reasonable with a clear echelon. Among them, there is 1 professor, 7 associate professors and 3 lecturers.

Double-Qualification Quality: All full-time teachers have enterprise practice experience. Among them, there are 11 Double-Qualified Teachers, accounting for 100%.

Disciplinary Orientation: All full-time teachers have a financial and economic disciplinary background, and their disciplinary orientations can cover all contents of the education and teaching of the higher vocational Customs Affairs and Foreign Trade Services major.

(II) Professional Leader

In principle, he/she shall have an associate senior professional title or above in this major or related majors and strong practical ability, be able to better grasp the development of the road transportation industry, water transportation industry, air transportation industry, multi-modal transport and transportation agency industry, loading, unloading, handling and warehousing industry, postal industry, internet and

related services, business services industry and the major at home and abroad, maintain extensive contacts with industry enterprises, understand the actual demand for talents of this major in industry enterprises, have strong capabilities in presiding over professional construction, carrying out education and teaching reform, teaching and research work and social services, and play a leading role in the reform and development of this major.

(III) Full-Time Teachers

Shall have college teacher qualification; in principle, shall have a bachelor's degree or above in related majors such as customs management, international economy and trade, logistics management; shall have a certain number of years of corresponding work experience or practical experience and reach the corresponding technical and skill level; shall have theoretical and practical capabilities in this major; shall be able to implement the requirements of curriculum ideology and politics and tap into ideological and political education elements and resources in professional courses; shall be able to use information technology to carry out teaching method reforms such as blended teaching; shall be able to track the frontiers of the development of the new economy and new technologies and carry out technological research and development and social services; professional teachers shall practice in enterprises or productive training bases for at least 1 month every year, with a cumulative enterprise practice experience of no less than 6 months every 5 years.

(IV) Part-Time Teachers

Mainly recruited from high-skilled talents in industries and enterprises related to this major, they shall have solid professional knowledge and rich practical work experience, generally have intermediate or above professional and technical positions (titles) or senior worker or above vocational skill level, understand the laws of education and teaching, and be able to undertake professional teaching tasks such as professional course teaching, internship and practical training guidance, and guidance on students' career development planning. Skill masters, model workers, skilled craftsmen and other high-skilled talents may be employed as needed, and specific implementation measures for the recruitment and management of part-time teachers shall be formulated in accordance with relevant national requirements.

XI. Teaching Conditions

(I) Teaching Facilities

Teaching facilities shall meet the needs of the implementation of talent training for this major. Among them, the area and facilities of training (experimental) rooms shall comply with the requirements of relevant professional training teaching condition standards (equipment configuration specifications) issued by the state. Information technology support shall meet the needs of professional construction, teaching management, information-based teaching and students' independent learning. This major has built a "trinity" professional practical teaching platform integrating on-campus simulation training rooms, on-campus comprehensive training centers and off-campus internship bases, which not only serves the training teaching activities of the customs affairs professional group, but also provides venues and technical support for various competitions, training services and other work, thus ensuring the steady

improvement of the overall level of training and practical teaching of this major.

(II) Teaching Resources

Mainly include textbooks, books, digital resources, etc., that can meet the needs of students' professional learning, teachers' professional teaching research and teaching implementation.

Basic Requirements for Textbook SelectionIn accordance with national regulations, textbooks shall be selected through standardized procedures, with priority given to national planned textbooks and national excellent textbooks. Professional course textbooks shall reflect the new technologies, new norms, new standards and new forms of the industry, and be dynamically updated through digital textbooks, loose-leaf textbooks and other methods.

Basic Requirements for Book and Document ProvisionThe provision of books and documents shall meet the needs of talent training, professional construction, teaching and research, etc. Professional books and documents mainly include: customs supervision laws and regulations, international practices related to international freight, supply chain management, cross-border e-commerce, etc. Timely configure books and documents related to the new economy, new technologies, new processes, new materials, new management methods, new service methods, etc.

Basic Requirements for Digital Teaching Resource ConfigurationConstruct and equip professional teaching resource databases related to this major, such as audio-visual materials, teaching courseware, digital teaching case databases, virtual simulation software, etc., which are rich in variety, diverse in form, convenient to use, dynamically updated and meet teaching needs. Strengthen the construction of teaching resource databases to realize the network sharing of core course teaching resources. Implement online teaching to assist classroom teaching through course websites and teaching resource database platforms, and realize the interaction between teachers and students in and after class. According to the actual needs of the reform of the talent training model, the teaching team organizes the compilation of school-based professional textbooks; continuously builds municipal-level excellent courses and school-level high-quality course construction website resources.

(III) Teaching Methods

Provide methodological guidance and suggestions for teaching implementation. Guide teachers to adopt appropriate teaching methods based on professional training objectives, course teaching requirements, students' learning situation and teaching resources to achieve expected teaching objectives. Advocate teaching students in accordance with their aptitude and needs, encourage innovative teaching methods and strategies, adopt methods such as integration of theory and practice teaching, case teaching, and project-based teaching, and adhere to "learning by doing and doing by learning". Professional core courses adopt teaching models such as task-driven and

project-led, and use various teaching methods such as case teaching method, task-driven teaching method, heuristic teaching method, and discussion-based teaching method, integrating "teaching, learning and doing" to enhance teaching interaction and improve teaching effectiveness.

(IV) Teaching Evaluation

Put forward suggestions on the evaluation methods for teachers' teaching and students' learning. The content of students' academic assessment and evaluation shall take into account cognitive, skill, emotional and other aspects. The evaluation shall reflect the diversification of evaluation standards, evaluation subjects, evaluation methods and evaluation processes, such as observation, oral examination, written examination, on-the-job operation, vocational skills competitions, vocational qualification identification and other evaluation methods. It is necessary to strengthen the quality monitoring of the teaching process and reform the standards and methods of teaching evaluation. Regularly organize experts and supervisors to review and supervise the implementation of the talent training program, and strictly control the teaching quality in each teaching link; establish performance appraisal systems and standards, and link teaching quality with performance appraisal; strengthen the construction and evaluation of teachers' morality.

The content of students' academic assessment and evaluation takes into account cognitive, skill and emotional aspects, with diversified evaluation standards and methods. Comprehensive evaluation of students' performance is carried out through group speeches, written examinations, classroom performance, skill operations and other aspects.

XII. Quality Assurance and Graduation Requirements

(I) Quality Assurance

The college establishes a professional talent training quality assurance mechanism, improves the professional teaching quality monitoring and management system, improves outcome evaluation, strengthens process evaluation, explores value-added evaluation, absorbs industry organizations, enterprises and other parties to participate in evaluation, and timely discloses relevant information to accept educational supervision and social supervision, and improves comprehensive evaluation. Improve the quality assurance construction of talent training programs, curriculum standards, classroom evaluation, experimental teaching, internship and training, graduation design and resource construction, and meet the requirements of talent training specifications through teaching implementation, process monitoring, quality evaluation and continuous improvement.

Schools and secondary colleges shall improve the teaching management mechanism, strengthen the organization, operation and management of daily teaching, regularly carry out diagnosis and improvement of curriculum construction, daily teaching and talent training quality, establish and improve systems such as class inspection, classroom observation, teaching evaluation and learning assessment, establish a supervision system for practical teaching links linked with enterprises, strictly enforce teaching discipline, strengthen the teaching organization function, and

regularly carry out teaching and research activities such as public classes and demonstration classes.

Professional teaching and research organizations shall establish a centralized lesson preparation system combining online and offline, hold regular teaching seminars, effectively improve professional teaching by using evaluation and analysis results, and continuously improve the quality of talent training.

Schools shall establish a graduate follow-up feedback mechanism and a social evaluation mechanism, analyze student source status, professional ethics, technical and skill levels, employment quality, etc., and regularly evaluate the quality of talent training and the achievement of training objectives.
